The Washington State Indian Education Association (WSIEA) takes an opportunity each year during our annual conference to acknowledge accomplishments of Native individuals who have contributed significantly to the education of Native people and of Native Student Excellence. These awards include:

- Indian Educator of the Year
- Indian Elder of the Year
- Indian Parent of the Year
- Higher Education Indian Student of the Year
- High School Indian Student of the Year

WSIEA honors one high school senior and one higher education student who will receive a monetary merit award (\$500 for high school seniors and \$1,000 for current college students). Award recipients will be announced at the WSIEA Awards Luncheon at the 33rd Annual WSIEA Conference happening April 3rd-5th, 2017 at the Northern Quest Resort & Casino in Airway Heights, WA. Nominations only need to be made for the Indian Educator of the Year, Elder of the Year, and Outstanding Indian Parent of the Year. *Applications/nominations must be postmarked on or before Friday March 24th, 2017. Please note: this is a hard deadline. No exceptions. Late applications/nominations will not be accepted.*

Association Background

The Washington State Indian Education Association was formally established in 1983. The purpose of WSIEA is to promote educational excellence for all Native American students through effectively influencing educational policy developments and implementation at state, regional and national levels in cooperation with other educators and educational institutions. WSIEA membership includes Indian educators, parents, and others who are dedicated to improving the quality of education for American Indian/Alaska Native learners. Each year the WSIEA recognizes members who have made significant contributions to the field of Indian education; the recognition award categories are:

- *Indian Elder of the Year*
- *Indian Educator of the Year*
- *Indian Parent of the Year*

All applicants shall be evaluated and verified by the WSIEA Recognition Award Committee (the award's committee is comprised of current WSIEA Board members in good standing). The award recipient shall be announced during the WSIEA Conference Recognition and Merit Awards Luncheon taking place during the 33rd Annual Conference April 3rd-5th, 2017 at Northern Quest Resort and Casino and two guests will be provided with tickets to this event.

Eligibility:

1. Nominations may be made by any individual WSIEA member who is in good standing. The nominee *does not* have to be a current WSIEA member.
2. You can nominate more than one person for each category. Submit one form for each nomination.
3. Nominees are required to submit verification of either: (1) membership in tribe, band or other organized group of Indians, including those tribes, bands or groups terminated since 1940 and those recognized by the state in which tribes, bands or organized groups reside; or (2) that they are a descendant in the first or second degree; or (3) that they are an Eskimo, Aleut or other Alaskan Native. Tribes, bands, or First Nations peoples from the U.S. are all considered eligible.
4. Attach the supporting material in an orderly fashion: a brief narrative biography, tribal affiliation documents (enrollment card or proof of descendency), and a recent photo are strongly encouraged but not required. Other materials *may* include recommendations, copies of achievements, lists of honors, articles, and citations showing year received.
5. Nominations need to *be postmarked on or before Friday March 24th, 2017 and sent to:*

Eligibility

1. Applicants are required to submit verification of either: (1) membership in tribe, band or other organized group of Indians, including those tribes, bands or groups terminated since 1940 and those recognized by the state in which tribes, bands or organized groups reside; or (2) that they are a descendant in the first or second degree; or (3) that they are an Eskimo, Aleut or other Alaska Native. Tribes, bands, or First Nations peoples in the U.S. and Canada are all considered eligible.
2. Applicant must be a graduating senior in high school for the 2015-2016 school year.
3. Applicant must be a Washington State resident.

Application Period

Applications must be postmarked on or before **March 24th, 2017. This is a hard deadline. No exceptions; late applications will not be accepted.**

Eligibility

1. Applicants are required to submit verification of either: (1) membership in tribe, band or other organized group of Indians, including those tribes, bands or groups terminated since 1940 and those recognized by the state in which tribes, bands or organized groups reside; or (2) that they are a descendant in the first or second degree; or (3) that they are an Eskimo, Aleut or other Alaska Native. Both United States and Canadian recognized nations, tribes, or bands are considered eligible.
2. Applicant must be a current college student.
3. Applicant must be a Washington State resident.
