# **Washington State Indian Education Association**

### Article II. Purpose

- Sec. A. To assist educators of American Indian/Alaska Native (hereinafter referred to as Native) children with the identification, promotion, and implementation of appropriate curricula and teaching styles suited to learning styles of Native students.
- Sec. B. To identify and promote educational excellence for Native students through the encouragement of parental, tribal, and community involvement.
- Sec. C. To effectively influence and recommend educational policy development and implementation at federal, state, regional, and local levels.
- Sec. D. To encourage and render assistance to school districts, school boards, colleges, and educational associations to assure cooperative involvement of Native communities in working for promotion of higher educational achievement of students.

### Article III. Membership

- Sec. A. The membership of this organization shall be open to anyone interested in improving educational opportunities for Native youth and adults. Membership is not limited to residents of Washington State.
- Sec. B. All individuals and affiliate organizations shall have voting privileges carrying one vote. Affiliate organization members shall designate one voting delegate only.
